NONPROFIT UPDATE

Lafayette Mural Awarded Navy Grant

On March 9, the Long Beach Navy Memorial Heritage Association (LBMHA) informed us that they had awarded a grant of **\$14,350** to restore the camel mural. The 8x8 foot mural had been uncovered when the roof on the Campbell Building was removed about a year ago.

While the grantor typically expects some matching funds in connection with the awarding of a grant, evidently the cost the HOA incurred in removing the mural from the rooftop was taken in consideration and no further funds are required from our organization.

One of the criteria, among many, that the LBMHA uses in awarding grants is that the **public** be able to enjoy the end product.

We anticipate that cleaning of the mural will start later in the spring and that the mounting of the mural on the southern wall of the Campbell Building(overlooking the garden and visible from the street) will occur during the summer. Keep an eye out for an **unveiling ceremony** once the work is completed!
